

amendment to 183, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The Hefner amendment is adopted. Do you have anything else on it?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lundy would move to amend the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lundy.

SENATOR LUNDY: Mr. Clerk, you might read the amendment, please.

CLERK: (Read Lundy amendment found on page 1526 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lundy.

SENATOR LUNDY: Mr. President and members, I just have offered this amendment so that everybody knows what is in that bill. I think that probably there are a good number that did not know what was in it. But Senator DeCamp's amendment will change the hours of on-sale liquor, on Sunday, from 6:00 p.m. to twelve o'clock, noon. It changes it from 6:00 p.m. to twelve o'clock noon. I just want to object to this and ask the Legislature to consider this amendment as I'm not sure it was considered fully the other day. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Well, Mr. President, I would rise in opposition to the amendment. I think it was very well considered. You will remember we had, I'm going to say probably, half a dozen people speak on the issue. And to explain the way the bill is now, a little more clearly, I would like to say, number one, it is local option. It doesn't mandate anything. It says from twelve o'clock noon on, instead of six o'clock, which is the current law, you can, if you are approved by local authorities or a local vote of the people, whichever the system they decide to use is, if the local authorities approve it then and only then can you market "hard liquor or alcoholic beverages from twelve o'clock on, on Sunday." The current law allows you, right now, with local option, to market or sell beer and wine from twelve o'clock on, with local option. This would
