SPEAKER NICHOL: You asking Senator Marsh?

SENATOR MARSH: Senator, I would like to respond by telling you that I've heard from several people on the floor what the State Fire Marshall said, but I have in front of me the testimony, and they aren't the same thing.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Senator Marsh, all I want to do is ask you a question. Don't use my time, please. Would you be willing to, at this point, or not?

SENATOR MARSH: I think I need some more explanation. My concern is that if this moves ahead then there is no reason for anyone to work on it.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Well what I would recommend is that I will tell you that I would like to see your problem solved, if there is a way to do it with this amendment that won't be injurious to other people. I would work on that with you, with the opposing factions out there to see if we could do it. If we can't do that I would have to oppose the amendment...

SENATOR MARSH: And that is fair enough because 383 is your basic bill and I am in support of that bill. I want the people on the legislative floor to know, though, and I'm reading from the draft of the public hearing. Wally Barnett did not appear in opposition. Wally Barnett appeared in a neutral position. "I am here today in an information-giving capacity. If the committee sees fit to put this out, that is fine." Those are the words of our State Fire Marshall. I want you to be aware that the fire department has adopted a code...the Fire Marshall's Office has a code adopted. However, if the rural fire departments have a problem the fire department may or may not have adopted a code enforcement program. A city ordinance within a fire district, that is fine. How do we solve the problem if the State Fire Marshall Office's...
