

want to pay for air bags, but we know that they are not as effective unless they are used with lap belts. We know that. We experience it. We read the tests. We understand that. So I don't think there is anything inappropriate about the automobile dealers and the manufacturers working with this legislation. Now Elizabeth Dole isn't out there all on her own. She is also having to work with the Supreme Court on this issue and some rules and regulations that they are telling her to work with. You all have had the statistics in front of you. You all are working with them. So we say to you, we know that air bags do not provide greater safety because we know that they do not work in rear end collisions and roll-overs and side collisions unless they are used with safety belts. Now, yes, there are those times when safety belts don't work. We know that there is a half of 1 percent. Not everything is perfect and why, for goodness sakes, does the American public expect the automobile to be perfect? It is a piece of equipment. You know all of a sudden we have all of these people out here saying, by golly, nothing else in this world is perfect, but we want the automobile to be perfect and we expect the automobile dealers and the automobile manufacturers to be perfect. Nothing else is, but it better be. Senator Chambers...that's appropriate, Governor, that's very appropriate. Round one. Senator Chambers...

PRESIDENT: In fact, that could designate one minute left.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Thank you. This is ridiculous. It is ridiculous and you know this amendment is ridiculous. I ask that the body not return to Select for the purpose of this amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I would also like to speak against the amendment because I'm hoping that Senator Chambers is using this for a talking point and is not really serious about the amendment. In fact, I suspect he's really not. But I want to be sure that you've looked at the amendment. It is on 1393 of the Journal and I hope you'll listen to the clarification. We're only talking about amendment one on page 1393. That's the only thing before the body right now. Not all four of those things listed, as Senator Chambers' amendments on 1393 so don't get confused by that. So, what does section one
