PRESIDENT: The Chair would remind you that we are on Select File and that we are required to be in our seats under the strictness of the rules and the Chair does get some requests from members occasionally to call this to your attention. We are on Select File, on Final Reading, excuse me. Even I am fallible this morning. The Chair recognizes Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President, I call the question.

PRESIDENT: I will put it to you. Do I see five hands? I do. The question is, shall the debate cease on this motion? All those in favor vote yes, opposed vote no. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion prevails. Senator Chambers, you may close. First, Senator Chambers, let me announce that Senator Miller has guests, 15 eleventh and twelfth graders from Campbell School in Campbell with two teachers along with them. If you will stand please, we'd like to welcome you to the State Legislature this morning. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I thought the debate would go on longer and somebody would mention other individuals who are in a delivery occupation. I don't know whether they are exempt so let me ask Senator Morehead. Senator Morehead, the only ones who would be exempted from this bill are those specifically granted an exemption by the language of the bill. Isn't that correct?

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Yes, Senator Chambers, and we've had passed out on your desk an amendment which Senator Hefner is offering this morning to bring up others, just one other group, but, yes, only those specifically exempted.
