

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Yes, we have...go on your time?

If rural becomes a word used in connection with others, there is going to have to be a definition of it and I'm wondering if we are going to be allowed to barter on the bill and put in those that we think ought to be given consideration, the 49 of us working in camaraderie as we're trying to do this morning, would you be amenable to that? To allow other groups...

SENATOR MOREHEAD: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, you just want to let Senator Hefner, whatever it is he is talking about get in.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: He talked to me earlier.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So he got your permission and approval.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: He is not harassing the bill.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Suppose, but those who deliver milk are interested. Do you care about those who deliver milk?

SENATOR MOREHEAD: You know that milk delivery on a day to day basis is an extinct animal now.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But if there are places where milk is delivered, and I think somebody might want to contend with you on that, would you be concerned about, would you be amenable to those people being exempted?
