

PRESIDENT: Your time has expired.

SENATOR DEKAMP: ...but it is obvious they do not want to have a vote and so, therefore, I guess that frees us all up to a degree to do what we want on amendments.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Goll.

SENATOR GOLL: Mr. President and members, I was going to call the question but I felt that there ought to be a few issues clarified as far as Senator Chambers' amendment. First of all, Senator Chambers, I am somewhat chagrined that you have called the body's attention to the famous Lizzie. I thought there was only one infamous Lizzie which dates back to 1910, 1911, and on through the teens and twenties and that was the famous Tin Lizzie, but in response to your amendment wherein you have...you have I believe added a section making the effective date September 1, 1989, and I would like to quote something to the body very briefly before we take a vote that the phase in passive restraint systems has been established, 10 percent of all automobiles manufactured after September 1, '86; 25 percent after September, '87; 40 percent after September of '88; and a 100 percent on September 1, 1989 which, Senator Chambers, is the date that you have as the effective date of our legislation. And what happens in the meantime? What happens in the next ten or twelve years? Because on the road will be those vehicles that are not equipped with passive restraints, and so it no longer becomes a question of whether the government should be involved, the issue now is what is the surest, best way in the protection of individuals. And although I wanted to address something and I believe I will, I believe I'll save it for later. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I wanted to talk about freedom a little bit. We got...Senator DeCamp got into the question of freedom and, of course, looking at it just in today's terms, looking at what is happening just today, there is a lot of concern and I have a lot of concern about whether the government is taking away people's freedom and whether this isn't an adverse thing we are doing overall.
