SENATOR MOREHEAD: That...that is in the form of a question to me? No, I do not think so, Senator Labedz, because I think that first of all most of these people are knowledgeable citizens out there. I think the media is going to do their job very well, and I think anybody that is taking a driver's exam and entering the arena of driving will know that. I think that some of the signs that are out there may have it added but I don't think it will be (interruption).

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Senator Morehead. Well, I say that the people entering the State of Nebraska, if it isn't done throughout the United States, will not know that Nebraska is one of the states that is requiring the people to buckle up when they reach the State of Nebraska. How can we fine anybody from another state for not using seat belts if they are not informed when they reach the State of Nebraska that we do have a law, and that they do have to buckle up? So I would think that there is going to be a cost to the State of Nebraska. Otherwise, there is absolutely no reason for us to stop a car say from Illinois that doesn't know that the State of Nebraska requires seat belts. So there will and should be a fiscal note with this bill specifying that it is going to cost some money to inform the outstate...the out of state people who are not
