

You don't have to make any deliveries, just make frequent stops. That is really what you do. Words are important, Senator Hefner, and sometimes people who deal with words in a careful fashion are deemed to be twisting words, but this is not twisting, this is taking the words that were put in the amendment by the sponsors of the bill, a person making frequent delivery stops without exiting from the vehicle. I would like to ask Senator Hefner a question so it won't seem that I am twisting words and he can help me deal with one of these words before I go on. Senator Hefner, is vehicle defined in this bill as far as you are aware of?

SENATOR HEFNER: Senator Chambers, I think you know the answer to that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, I want...Senator Marsh said, yes. I need a reference to where the definition is. That is what I was asking for.

SENATOR HEFNER: I believe it is.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Marsh...oh, Senator Pirsch is going to give me hers. Where do you find the definition? Page 2, line 16, "As used in Sections 1 and 3 to 6 of this act, motor vehicle shall mean a vehicle required by Section 39...and so forth to be equipped with safety belts." Senator Hefner, your amendment doesn't deal with a motor vehicle. Your amendment deals with any vehicle. So a vehicle is different from a motor vehicle and if you read definitions in the statute, you will find that even the term "motor vehicle" has different definitions based on the purpose. We had a law that was going to deal with breaking and entering into a motor vehicle, so they defined it differently so that it wouldn't include things like motorcycles and some of the other things which under the broad definition of motor vehicle would be included. Even this definition limits motor vehicle to a certain section of statute dealing with certain types of conveyances that are required to have safety belts. So "vehicle" is a broader term than "motor vehicle". And, again, I know it doesn't make anybody...
