SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President, I saw Senator Schmit around here a little while ago and Senator Sieck.

PRESIDENT: He is excused on the record, Senator. The Clerk will proceed with the roll call.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on page 1558 of the Legislative Journal.) 18 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The motion failed. Senator Chambers...I mean, Senator Morehead, I recognize you for your motion.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Mr. President, I would like to move that we advance the bill back to E & R Engrossing.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to return the bill to E & R for Engrossment. All those in favor...yes, yes, machine vote is requested and will be accommodated. All those in favor vote aye...it is debatable. All right. It is debatable and the Chair recognizes you if you choose to use the floor, Senator Chambers.
