CLERK: (Continued reading the roll call vote as found on page 1559 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: May we have your attention, please. The Clerk wants to verify the vote.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote.) 26 ayes, 17 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion prevails. Senator Nichol. Speaker Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I have a faint suspicion that a few of you are getting mentally fatigued with this bill, so I am going to ask that we leave it for today and go on with other things. We have one other bill to read on Final Reading and then proceed on with the other portion of the program. So with your permission, Senator Morehead, we will leave your bill for today. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Return then to Final Reading, LB 61.

CLERK: (Read LB 61 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 61 pass? All those in favor vote yes, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 1560 of the Legislative Journal.) 40 ayes, 0 nays, 6 excused and not voting, 3 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: By that vote then, LB 61 is enacted into law and that completes Final Reading for the day. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign, LB 61. Matters for the record, Mr. Clerk.
