CLERK: 36 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of LR 85, Mr. President. (See page 1576 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: LR 85 is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, in conjunction with that, if I might, Senator Goll would like to add his name to the resolution as co-introducer.

PRESIDENT: Without objection, so ordered. We have a motion here now on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senators Vard Johnson and Wesely would move to reconsider the indefinite postponement of LB 190. Their motion is found on page 1444 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Vard Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker...

PRESIDENT: May we have order in the Chamber, please, as we begin our deliberations. (Gavel.) Senator Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, this is a pretty simple motion. In a moment of pique a week ago the Legislature killed the cigarette tax bill, LB 190, and I joined in the killing of the cigarette tax bill because I was exercised and I am certain that a lot of people in this body were equally exercised so we voted to
