

SENATOR HABERMAN: But they didn't put out a new fiscal note?

SENATOR WESELY: Well, yes, they did. If you'll look at the fiscal note, the fiscal analyst projection is \$34,000, \$33,000. That's what the A bill is for.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Okay.

SENATOR WESELY: They came to me and explained why they had a lower figure and I said that sounds reasonable, that's what we use.

SENATOR HABERMAN: All right, thank you. Now the first fiscal note stated that additional employees would be needed. They are going to have to travel throughout the county, the state, explaining the plan to the county board and the employees and then in return to assist the county clerk in establishing prior service benefits. So, quite frankly, I don't believe the A note. Now what happens if we pass the A bill and they have more cost? Unless somebody stays on top of it we'll never know and if we stay on top of it, it won't make any difference because we've already put it into effect. Now may I ask Senator Wesely another question, please? The bill says all county employees or hired by the county. Does this include county attorneys and does it include assistant county attorneys?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Wesely, would you respond to the question, please.

SENATOR WESELY: What?

SENATOR HABERMAN: The question, does it include county attorneys because it says all employees of the county?

SENATOR WESELY: That's right. All county employees would be covered under this.

SENATOR HABERMAN: And that means that the assistant county attorneys would also be covered under the plan.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, all county employees, yeah.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you. One more point, Mr. President. It was interesting to notice on the roll
