

some guests in the south balcony of Senator Hefner. There are 18 students and seven adults from Hadar Public Schools in Nebraska and two teachers. Would you please stand and be recognized. Miss Rogge, (phonetic) I think you are a distant relative of mine, but I'm not sure. Do you have something to read in, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Vard Johnson has amendments to be printed to 715 and Senator DeCamp amendments to 606. (See pages 1581-87 of the Legislative Journal.) That's all that I have.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The students from Hadar, Nebraska, we don't allow displaying of placards or signs while you're in the balcony. Thank you. No, Hadar is in Senator Hefner's district. We will move on to LB 553. Senator Landis is gone for a few moments and we'll come back to 401 after 553.

CLERK: Mr. President, 553 is a bill offered by Senators Schmit and Miller. (Title read.) The bill was read on January 22. It was referred to Public Works for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are Public Works Committee amendments pending.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lamb, are you going to handle this? Okay.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President and members, this is a bill that has to do with equipment which moves houses and the committee amendment merely strikes language relating to city streets and county highways. Building movers would have to receive separate permits from the cities or counties if the buildings were to be moved on city streets or county highways. The amendment also clarifies that the five-mile per hour limitation only applies to the vehicle during the period when the building is being moved pursuant to the permit. In other words, when the machinery is being moved without a building on it, the five miles per hour does not apply. I would move the amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: I understand we have an amendment to the committee amendments by Senator Schmit.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schmit would move to amend the committee amendments and that amendment is on page 1325 of the Journal.
