PRESIDENT: Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I'd call the question, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: I'll put the question to you, if you want to have the matter decided, let you decide. Do I see five hands to cease debate? I do. I'll put the question to you, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. The Chair will allow 20 seconds for the recording of your vote. The motion that has been made is to cease debate on the kill motion. Obviously 25 votes are required for the motion to prevail. Ten seconds are left. Do you wish to cease debate? Please vote. Do you wish to cease debate? Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? The Clerk will record. Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Mr. President, are we under call, Mr. President?

PRESIDENT: No, we are not.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I would ask for a call of the house and ask that call in votes be accepted for a minute or two.

PRESIDENT: Because we were under call previously, and not being able to go back immediately on a simple majority vote, the vote to place us under call now will require 25 votes. The request has been made for the house to come under call. All those in favor of the house coming under call vote aye, opposed vote nay. Twenty-five votes required. Twenty seconds to record your vote, shall the house...do you want the house to come under call? Please record your vote. The motion is, shall the house come under call? Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion prevails. The house is under call. Now, Senator Hoagland, what do you want?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I wonder if we could take call in votes on the motion to cease debate?

PRESIDENT: We may. The vote was in progress on the motion.
