

please. Senator Pirsch, Senator Landis, please return to the Chamber. Would the Sergeant-at-Arms inquire as to the whereabouts of those senators. Senators Landis and Pirsch, would you report...excuse me. Thank you. Senator Landis. The search for Senator Landis is underway while the house remains under call. Senator Vickers, Senator Landis is the only one missing. We are awaiting his arrival. Senator Landis, would you report to the Legislative Chamber, please. The house is under call. If anyone knows the whereabouts of Senator David Landis, we would appreciate having you direct him to the Legislative Chamber. Senator Landis remains the only one that we have not been able to locate thus far. Senator Landis has arrived. Roll call vote has been requested. The issue before you is the Goll amendment to the Schmit amendment to LB 608. The Clerk will call the roll. Remain silent so that your voice vote may be heard. Call the roll, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1613-14 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion prevails. The Goll amendment to the amendment is adopted. Call of the house is raised. We are back...is there a further amendment on the desk, Mr. Clerk? The motion is to adopt the Schmit amendment as amended. There is another amendment on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schmit would move to amend his own amendment. (See Schmit amendment found on page 1614 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I will be very brief. The amendment that I have offered now is \$225. I think it is a reasonable amendment. I thought \$235 was reasonable. I do not think that \$210 is reasonable. I would ask you to support the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Anybody wish to speak on the amendment offered by Senator Schmit? I recognize Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, members, I don't know whether to vote for the Schmit amendment or not. It seems to me that business is telling this body that because of the depressed agricultural economy that, therefore, we cannot
