PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I know what is going to happen to this bill and every other one like it. The cost of doing business. The business of America is business is what the robber baron said, and the politician said, by God, you are right, and they had a prayer. They always got a chaplain. These kind of people always have the chaplains. Mafia members contribute heavily to the church. They all go to church, all their members go to church. They don't use dope, they don't get their children on dope, but they sell it to everybody else, and that is this Legislature. The yippy yapping and yammering until it is disgusting, and you all would be as disgusted as I am if there were people about whom you had any concern and they were treated in the way these unfortunate people are being treated by this Legislature.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, there have been some good arguments here. I think we all understand the issue very thoroughly. You know it is always kind of interesting, and I guess that I visited with a number of businessmen. Some of them are very irate about this bill. But I like to ask them very frankly, now what
