

CLERK: Mr. President, 457 was a bill that was introduced by Senators Scofield and Vickers. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 21 of this year, Mr. President. It was referred to the Business and Labor Committee for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending. Mr. President, before that, however, Senator Haberman has moved to bracket the bill until January 15, 1986. That is a priority motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barrett, would you care to take up the committee amendments on this bill?

SENATOR BARRETT: Yes, I would, Mr. President, thank you. The bill itself, 457, simply creates the Hazardous Materials Disclosure Act. The committee amendments would remove the bill's regulation of common carriers. It also redefines hazardous materials and provides a delayed operative date on the bill until January 1st of 1986 and some other technical corrections. Mr. President, I would move the adoption of the committee amendments. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: There is an amendment to the committee amendments on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a...I actually have two amendments to the committee amendments. The first is by Senator Vickers.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. Clerk, don't you have two amendments from me to the committee amendments?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR VICKERS: Okay. This is the first one for the common carriers?

CLERK: Well, this is the one, Senator, that was prepared up in the bill drafting office.

SENATOR VICKERS: Okay.

CLERK: Okay?
