PRESIDENT: Thank you very much, Senator Carsten. Is there anyone else? Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature, sincere thanks for the years of service which Senator Carsten has given on behalf of trees in the State of Nebraska.

PRESIDENT: Senator, excuse me a minute. (Gavel.) May we have order, please. Go ahead, Senator.

SENATOR MARSH: I believe each of us through the years has felt the impact of trees on our own lives whether we grew up in a city, a small town, or on the farm. I believe that trees have meant something to our parents and our grandparents and they will continue to be important to our children, our grandchildren and the generations to come. The tree is symbolic for us today because we are ready to celebrate the 100th birthday of Arbor Day. I am very pleased to support LR 90 and I urge the members of the Legislature to consider the meaning, not only of the symbolic tree, but the 100th anniversary of Arbor Day as together we take vacation time next Monday. Thank you, Senator Carsten, for your long years of leadership, particularly bringing to the attention of this legislative body the need for, the appreciation of, and the helpfulness of trees to the lives of Nebraskans.
