SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, I would request a call of the house.

PRESIDENT: Very well. A call of the house has been requested. The question is, shall the house come under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT: The motion prevails and the house is under call. All members of the Legislature outside the Chamber within hearing distance of my voice, please be notified that the house is under call and your presence is requested in the Legislative Chamber. Those that are in the Chamber, please look up to front board and see that your presence light is on. Call in votes, I think, we may authorize. You may call in your votes on the Chambers amendment if you wish, aye or nay.

CLERK: Senator Chronister voting yes.

PRESIDENT: Senator Conway, we need your presence light on for a call of the house, Senator Rupp also, Senator Harris and Goll, Senator Landis. Senator Rod Johnson. Senator Higgins, please, presence light.

CLERK: Senator Harris voting yes. Senator Baack voting yes. Senator Remmers voting yes. Senator Nelson voting yes. Senator Lowell Johnson voting yes. Senator Beyer voting yes. Senator Peterson voting yes.

PRESIDENT: Have you all voted? You may still vote by calling in your vote.

CLERK: Senator Rod Johnson voting yes. Senator Higgins voting yes. Senator Withem voting yes.

PRESIDENT: Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion prevails and the amendment is adopted. What else is on the desk?
