

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Conway, do you want to wish your little bill bon voyage?

SENATOR CONWAY: Mr. Speaker, I am not sure that is the phraseology I would use, in terms of bon voyage. I would like to move advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to advance LB 154 which is debatable and the Chair recognizes Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I just have one comment. In view of what Senator Rupp has acknowledged about the difficulties of the bill, I am not going to hold it up at this point but I do have some serious concerns with it which I will...maybe some of them I can talk to you about before we even come up for another debate.

PRESIDENT: All right. Any further discussion? The motion is the advancement of LB 154. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. The motion is the advancement of LB 154. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance 154.

PRESIDENT: 154 is advanced. LB 608, we will continue...the call of the house is raised. The first three bills on your green sheet there, 608, 102, and 457 were disposed of yesterday, and Senator DeCamp is absent so we will skip over 687, and if Senator Beutler is ready, is Senator Beutler on deck?

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 518 was introduced by Senator Beutler. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 22. It was referred to the Education Committee for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are Education Committee amendments pending. Senator Warner does have a motion, Mr. President, that would be priority motion.
