SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members...

PRESIDENT: May we have order in the Chamber, please? There is a lot of (gavel) members who are going to have to vote on this motion in just a little bit, better hear what is being said about germaneness. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I agree with Senator Vickers that it is not germane and everything he has said with regard to the deterioration of the process I am sure will happen if we start loosening up on and allowing this sort of thing to happen. However, on the other hand, I certainly believe that Senator Carson has a legitimate point with regard to the abuse of the lease-purchase process and I think the law does need to be tightened up, and if this germaneness motion is not...overruling of the Chair is not successful, which I hope it is not, I hope he will put up a motion to suspend the rules and do it notwithstanding the germaneness problem because I will support that particular motion, the suspension of the rules, but I don't think that we should support a germaneness...an overruling of the Chair on the germaneness motion because that is going to set a precedent that we will have a very difficult time with in the near future. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Pappas.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Mr. President and colleagues, I rise to support Senator Carson and to clarify a few things Senator Vickers said which I am very shocked and dismayed that Senator Vickers would make statements like he said this morning. Senator Vickers, when you were speaking just a moment ago, I was kind of dismayed at some of the statements you made about trashing up priority bills, other people's priority bills, and I said to myself, I said, golly, you know Senator Carson had a priority bill here a week or so ago, I think they called it LB 60, that was a priority bill that somebody tried to put things on it that originally weren't intended on it. You know I can't understand how you was talking like that, Senator Vickers. And as far as the
