

and 22. This language was changed on General File by an amendment by Senator DeCamp. We tried to strike it on Select File. I'm trying again. I would be happy to vote for the bill with the E clause if those two lines, lines 21 and 22 on page 19, return to their former reading.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, what is that old song? You've got to know when to hold 'em, know when to fold 'em. Well, this is the time to fold on the Sunday portion of the bill despite the fact I think it is amply justified. You already have private clubs doing the identical thing. This would require local option. However, that is not the case or not the issue. The issue is the bill. As you must have just read the letter from the Liquor Commission, it is a complete rewrite of all the liquor laws which have not been dealt with since prohibition and it also deals with a Supreme Court case that has declared a very significant portion of the liquor laws of the state unconstitutional. Those are important, and those are important that they be passed with the emergency clause so they can go into effect immediately. Therefore, if this little tail on the bill that is, in my opinion, amply justified is, however, causing problems, the best thing to do, when you reach the final line, is to cut off the offending tail. So we will cut it off. I certainly will accept the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Does anyone else wish to speak on the motion? The motion is to return the bill to Select File for a specific amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

PRESIDENT: The motion prevails. The bill has been returned to Select File. Now the motion for amendment. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: I move to strike the new language on lines 21 and 22 of page 19 of LB 183, and to reattach the E clause, Mr. Speaker.

PRESIDENT: Do you have that amendment, Mr. Clerk?
