LB 383, 383A, 413

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 1731 of the Legislative Journal.) 43 ayes, 0 nays, 4 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 383 is declared passed. Now we are ready for LB 383A.

CLERK: (Final Reading of LB 383A.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 383A pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Something is not recording, Mr. Clerk. Revote for us, please, aye or nay on 383A. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 1731-32 of the Legislative Journal.) 43 ayes, 0 nays, 4 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 383A is declared passed. Without objection we will skip over LB 395 because the appropriations bill is not with it at the present time, on to LB 413.

CLERK: Mr. President, 413, I have a motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Motion on the desk.

CLERK: Senator Landis would move to return to the bill for a specific amendment. The amendment is on page 1612 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, this is the bill that permits state employees to be sent to conferences even in their own home town and to have their luncheon paid for them. But there was language in the bill that said that any remuneration could not be beyond federal taxable income. To ensure that there could be no possible conflict between LB 413 and this granted authority for expenses and the program that we have now put in place for legislative expenses, I have stricken the language in LB 413 that makes reference to the limitation of expenses to the area of federal taxable income. Now I am assured that, even if we left that language in, 413 would not impact our
