

SENATOR DECAMP: I guess. I remember that very law, and I was trying to point that out to you the other day on the rule on resolutions, to you and Senator Beutler and the other lawyers, and you took another approach on that day. That was when I said the specific law that said we only had 25 votes...

SENATOR LANDIS: Well, you know that wasn't on Monday, and it wasn't on Tuesday. I think it was in the last half of the week, and I think there is a different rule that applies there.

SENATOR DECAMP: Right, I see, okay. Well, all I am concerned about on this particular proposal is making sure that those senators who want to fly can fly without all this proposal or problems,...

PRESIDENT: One minute, Senator.

SENATOR DECAMP: ...otherwise I do support your amendment and ask you whether you would be receptive to clearing up the language on flying.

SENATOR LANDIS: In another bill, certainly. This bill...this puppy has been taken care of and ready to go, Senator DeCamp. I think we ought to pass it. Take this and make this amendment today. If you can make another amendment today, that is fine.

SENATOR DECAMP: Well, I want to clear up so that Senator Conway and I would have no fear of flying.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to return. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I don't often get this opportunity, but I'm going to take it today. I want every senator in this Chamber to remember each time you get that expense reimbursement check, each month, which is more than what you earn in a month, you are looking, if you are looking at me, you are looking at the one who fought very, very hard to achieve that. Overrode a governor's veto, pushed on the legal action until we now get a small measure of justice. I just thought I'd throw that in this morning.
