There was an exciting amount of research and development that came out of that country and I came away from that experience with a healthy respect for our defense industry. However, I do believe that there is a good economic reason for supporting this type of a resolution and I appreciate the concerns expressed in this resolution for the impact that the nuclear arms race has on agriculture.
