

administration of this is with federal dollars through the Veterans Administration and the actual allowance that the veteran would get per month would be \$100 per month which would be taken out of his own salary as he worked on the job, on the on the job training program, and at the end of 36 months the federal dollars through the VA would refund that \$100 a month to him for the 36 months that he was in the program. It is for that reason that we ask you to pass the resolution and we can ask Congress to add this feature to that so all veterans would be treated the same. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on LR 109? If not, the motion is to adopt the resolution. All those in favor vote yes, opposed vote no. Please record your vote on LR 109 as explained by Senator Goodrich. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of LR 109, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LR 109 is adopted. Next we have a half hour time for the discussion of LR 97.

CLERK: Mr. President, 97 was offered by Senator Chambers. It is found on page 1691 of the Journal. (Read.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, this is a melancholy and gloomy topic. It relates to something that will be a spot on the history of humanity as long as human beings walk on this Earth. Mr. Reagan is an individual whom people have tried to excuse for every manner of insensitivity and bad judgment. This latest instance is a matter which cannot be overlooked, which cannot be ignored and which I think places a responsibility on all elected officials as well as citizens and groups who are aware of the seriousness of this situation to try to bring about a measure of rectification by persuading the President, through any means available, to cancel this visit to a cemetery where are buried some of the worst criminals of the Nazi regime. As pointed out in the resolution, the Waffen SS were not typical soldiers. They were not combatants. They were the elite corps whose responsibility was to operate death camps and preside over
