

SPEAKER NICHOL: The committee amendments are adopted. May I introduce some guests of Senator Hartnett, please. In the north balcony there are 22 students from St. Mary's School of Bellevue at Bellevue, Nebraska, eighth graders and three sponsors. Would you please stand, all of you, and be recognized. Thank you for visiting the Legislature this afternoon. Now we're back to the committee amendments. Okay. Mr. Clerk, I understand you have other amendments.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment to the bill is offered by Senator Vard Johnson. Senator Johnson's amendment is on page 857 of the Journal.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vard Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Excuse me just a moment, I've got to find out what my amendment is.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Okay, Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I have an amendment that I have printed in the Journal. This amendment is quite a bit like the one that Senator Pappas just put on the bill. Senator Pappas put a little dinky amendment on the bill a few minutes ago to help out a constituent with a subchapter S corporation. Well I had a constituent come to me, it's pretty rare that it happens, but I had one come to me who said to me that he had a very small business and he had to remit sales taxes on a monthly basis because of the small business. And apparently one has to remit sales taxes on a monthly basis if one collects more than \$300 a month I guess in the taxes so he asked me if we could change the law so that he would have to remit on a less frequent basis than a monthly basis, like on a quarterly basis. So I said, well I can try it, this is a good bill to try it on. So our work was to not require a person to have to remit the sales taxes on a monthly basis until he had collected \$900 or more a month in the taxes and that is what the amendment would do.
