

take a lot of your time, but we saw what the federal government did. We did about 90 percent, 95 percent of what they did and we had some slight change over what they did, so we basically do piggyback and we did try and set up a sunset at virtually the same time they were because we were really trying to carry on what they are doing there. I think they are going to probably extend, at least that's what I hear, but other say not. I don't know what is going to happen, but there is a lot of debate in Washington just like we're debating what do we do with those solar tax credits? They are looking at extending it to 1992 as well.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you. Okay, thank you. I wondered where the date of 1992 came from since it did seem to me to be an inordinate extension of the time and while I do not think we should cut back on the solar time credits, I'm not sure that at this time I could support the 1992 year. But I appreciate the cost that this is to the state and I guess I would regretfully have to oppose the extension until 1992 at this time. Thank you.

SENATOR LAMB: The Chair recognizes Senator Marsh to address the amendment.

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you, Senator Lamb and members of the Legislature, I have currently an amendment to this amendment being drafted. I do not feel that we should penalize those persons who in full faith have solar dollars invested in energy saving in 1985. As the proposal before us without the Wesely amendment would, anyone who spent dollars in 1984 would be able to have their dollars protected with a refund apportion, I think they intended, the intention originally was that anyone who has invested in energy saving with solar systems through 1985 to the first of January 1986 would be able to apply for those refunds. I think we have to honor that commitment, but I cannot at this time support Don Wesely's amendment in its current form. Mr. Clerk, not quite ready. Yeah, just a moment.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Marsh is in the process of drafting an amendment to the amendment.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Lamb, it is my understanding that perhaps Senator Pappas already has an amendment such as I need drafted. Is Senator Pappas in the room? Senator Pappas is on the phone. I'll just hold for the moment.
