CLERK: Senator Lamb voting no.

SENATOR LAMB: Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 8 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR LAMB: The motion fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Vard Johnson, Senator, this is on page 1241 of the Journal.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Vard Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Excuse me, Senator Lamb, it takes a while to find these things. Senator Lamb, the oil and gas dealers are allocating a small amount of the shrink to a fund to cover losses that occur when folk don't properly remit the gas tax that they have collected and we have discovered that there could be up to \$1 million in improperly and unremitted gas tax.
