SENATOR LABEDZ: Yes, I certainly do. As I told you before we went to lunch, there were several senators that told me that they were utterly, totally confused as to what was going on on LB 717. I asked their opinion as to whether or not we should bracket the bill for a week and give them time to dissolve some of the things that were said on the floor, possibly check with the businesses in their area. And over the lunch hour it didn't seem to change because I did meet and talk and visit with some of the senators. They, too, are of the opinion that this should be either, as the Speaker would decide, to put it on the bottom of General File, or to bracket it until next week. Possibly Senator Johnson and Senator DeCamp can answer some of the questions they have. Otherwise we will be on this all afternoon and we will be asking questions all afternoon. This way it could be done according to the way the Speaker decides, to either hold it or if we have to have a vote on it, fine. But at least give them the opportunity to show, by their vote, that they would prefer to hold that over at least a week. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right thank you. Senator Haberman, please.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the body, I'm going to support the bracket motion. I'd like to have you think of something for just a minute, those of you who are here and listening. We spent hours, and hours, and hours, and days on the seat belt bill. Yes, argued, and fought, and discussed, and understood what it was all about. Yesterday we passed one of the biggest tax raising bills in the history of Nebraska in an hour and a half, just boom, we raised all those taxes. Now today we have another issue before us that is very complicated, very, very important. And from what we were doing this morning, we are all ready to go boom, let's push it ahead and let's go. But I think the time has come that when we come to these serious bills, if we can take the time for a seat belt bill, we can take the time to find out exactly what is going on on this banking bill. Because there are a lot of questions that have to be cleared up. For example, we would like to have Senator Johnson explain why Citicorp isn't covered, why S & Ls aren't covered? Can we pass special legislation? I
