

lottery activity and seeking, in the resolution, the appropriate remedies against the county attorneys who are not now enforcing the laws against them, up to and including impeachment?

SENATOR HEFNER: Senator DeCamp, what does this have to do with the Conway amendment?

SENATOR DECAMP: It has to do with your statements on the Conway amendment about you were so happy that the video lottery portion, LB 144, didn't get in the bill. I was, therefore, expressing my concern, since you were so happy that that occurred, I am happy...or unhappy that video lottery activity does exist and there are no enforcements or sanctions against it, and most important no taxation against it.

SENATOR HEFNER: I cannot support where you say that there are 15 or 20 definitely going on.

SENATOR DECAMP: I said if I bring to you the names and locations of 15 or 20 at a minimum, just as a sample, will you then work with me in presenting a resolution to the Legislature to seek enforcement from the Attorney General and sanctions against the local county attorneys in those areas?

SENATOR HEFNER: Senator DeCamp, I am always willing to work with you.

SENATOR DECAMP: You're going to get your chance.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Labeledz, please.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I just wanted...and I'm sorry I didn't hear the rest of what Senator DeCamp had to say. I was preoccupied. But I, too, want to stand here for the record to say there are video machines in Omaha and they are paying off. I have been through almost every county in this state. I have stopped at clubs and organizations. There are video machines. I had to refuse payment, saying I'm a State Senator, and I do not have any money coming, just credits. Thank you.
