

state aid to education are making such a move, and he is right. The fact of the matter is this body passed a bill last year to provide property tax relief through state aid to education. We sent it to the Governor's office and it was vetoed. Now some of the people who are standing up this morning saying, we want property tax relief, some of them didn't vote for that bill last year. That is fine because, you know, they wised up and it is great. I hope they are still that wise this fall when we are brought back in to deal with the issue of how we fund education because we are going to be. We are not the ones that make the call. Oh, there is a mechanism whereby we can but we know we are not going to do it. The Governor has already said he is going to bring us back to deal with this issue. The Governor has already signed 662 and some of you have said he shouldn't have. I happen to think that he should have but it doesn't make any difference. He did. And as part of that bill it says there was going to be a study on how we fund education and that has begun. You know, if there is one thing that I have learned in here is that this body certainly doesn't do like we do it out on the farm. We don't plow the same damn field over and over and over again. You know, we move from one acre to the next. In this body we wind up plowing up the same acre over and over and over and pretty quick it is nothing but dust. This issue is one we are going to be dealing with this fall. It is one we are going to be dealing with all summer. I think it is rather silly that we spend so much time dealing with it right now, but, quite frankly, I don't care. If you want to plow the field over and over and over, I will be out there with a plow with you, but we in our infinite wisdom along with the help of the Governor are going to figure out a logical, reasonable mechanism to provide the funds to run education in this state and I think provide property tax relief while we are doing it. I suggest to you it is not going to happen until this fall and I want it to happen this fall. I don't want to wait until 1987. I don't want to wait until half of us that are out there on their own property are going to be broke and aren't going to be there to pay the property taxes anyhow. We need to do it right away. But I don't think we are going to get it done with LB 505, not in this session. With that, I think Senator Wesely would like to have a minute or two of my time in closing. If he would like I will give whatever time I have left, Mr. President, to Senator Wesely.
