SENATOR V. JOHNSON: (Microphone not activated)...call of the house and a roll call vote.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 1 nay to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Will you please record your presence. I believe almost all of you are here, so if you would record your presence, we would appreciate it. Senators Haberman and Higgins are excused. Thank you. Senator Schmit, please. Senator Rod Johnson. We are waiting for Senator Rod Johnson. I understand Senator Rod Johnson will be here shortly. Please remain in your seats while we are under call, please. Your rules. I understand Senator Higgins is also on her way. I understand we are all here now with the exception of Senator Haberman who is excused for the day. The question is the adoption of the Vickers amendment to the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay and a roll call vote has been asked for. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on page 1914 of the Legislative Journal.) 21 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The Vickers amendment loses, does not pass. May I introduce some guests before we go on to the next amendment. Senator Remmers, I believe had some visitors in the north balcony.
