

SPEAKER NICHOL: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President, to cease debate.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The call is raised, and debate has ceased. Senator Remmers, did you wish to close, please? Well, let's see, yes.

SENATOR REMMERS: I guess I don't really have much to say to close it. I just feel that I had originally invested a small group but in this case I don't believe we are going to get an agreement at all. I just can't see that we are going to get any agreements at all in this session and I think for that reason it is time to just cut off the debate and go on to some other important issues. I ask you to vote for the ending of this debate on this issue.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you. The question is the indefinite postponement of LB 505. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. A simple majority. I don't want to call the vote too quickly but if you would like to vote, please do so since you are practically all here.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker, I would just go ahead right this moment and ask that everybody check in because I think we are still under call.

SPEAKER NICHOL: No, I raised the call.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Oh, then in which case I would ask that we go under call and I am going to ask for a roll call vote.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right, the question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Now please record your presence. Those outside the Chamber please return and record your presence. A roll call vote has been asked for on the indefinite postponement of LB 505. And Senators Higgins and Haberman are the only two excused. Senator Schmit, please. Thank you. Okay, did you ask for a roll call vote? All right, and we are voting on the indefinite
