SENATOR VICKERS: ...to me part of the reason I am in as much trouble as I am. It says to me that the people that have been living in that part of that school district, in that county, have been paying probably more than their share already by a long ways. I think income is a logical approach. I think the mechanism as laid out in the committee amendment makes sense. I would urge you to reject the Warner amendment and stick with the committee amendments.
