LB 216, 273, 667, 715, 722

Senator Barrett and I simply would ask for your support of bracketing this motion at this time. I think a study would be the best way to go with it and so, thank you.

PRESIDENT: Very well, the motion is to bracket LB 667. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk. A roll call has been requested. Senator Higgins requested a roll call. Did we hear correctly, Senator Higgins, do you want a roll call vote? Record vote, very well.

CLERK: (Record vote read as found on pages 1940-41 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 16 nays on the motion to bracket the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: By that vote the bill is bracketed and the call of the house is raised. Next bills, Mr. Clerk. Do you have anything for the record first?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports LB 715 to Select File, 273 to Select File, signed by Senator Hall.

Senator Lynch would like to print amendments to 722. (See pages 1941-49 of the Legislative Journal.)

I have gubernatorial appointments. That will be referred to the Reference Committee.

Mr. President, the next bill for consideration... Mr. President, the next bill is 216. Senator Hall, I do have E & R amendments, Senator.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I'd move the E & R amendments be adopted.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to adopt the E & R amendments. All those in favor of the E & R amendments say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried the amendments are adopted. The call has been raised.

CLERK: Senator DeCamp, I understand you're going to withdraw your amendments. I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hall.
