

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I'd move that LB 382 be advanced from Select File to E & R for Engrossment.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion to advance. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried. The bill is advanced. LB 372.

CLERK: Mr. President, 372, the first item I have, Senator, are E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: I'd move the E & R amendments be adopted.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion. All those in favor of adopting the amendments say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried. The amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Landis would move...Senator Landis, I understand the amendments on 625, Senator, you want to withdraw. Is that right? That was the first version you gave me.

SENATOR LANDIS: And you have the second version with the reasonable notice provision. That will be fine, yes, withdraw them and substitute the second one.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Landis' amendment is on page 1908.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, this, too, is a product of some negotiation and discussion between the fire fighters and representatives of the municipalities. It has the acquiescence of both parties. It indicates that in cities with city manager forms of government there will be a recommendation that is nonbinding by the Civil Service Commission. That nonbinding recommendation will be made to the city manager and reviewed in a public hearing before the city manager and the governing body. There will be appropriate notice, reasonable notice given to each police officer and fire fighter by first class mail. Secondly, that there will also be a nonbinding recommendation in cities that do not
