

fashion for the same thing. I should think that any city could issue bonds if it chose to do so. I have not been in favor of these types of taxes and I certainly have not been in favor of the variable gas tax that occurs at the state level. Mr. Chairman, excuse me for a moment. \$12 million for the county and 25 for the city and Senator Goodrich said property tax, so then they are going to tax them twice, Senator Goodrich, if you will come to your mike please. Can a person bring his or her tax statement, property tax statement, to the filling station and show that they have been taxed once and be exempted from an additional penny per gallon?

SENATOR GOODRICH: No, because this would be a separate set of roads that they would be building and the new roads would be funded from this tax. The old issues would be funded from the property taxes. The new set, this is a third issue in other words, would be paid for by the one cent tax.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And when you say new roads, you mean land that doesn't presently have a road on it, when you say new roads?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Say, again, that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, when you said we are talking about new roads, you are talking about land that has no road of any kind on it now and this money...

SENATOR GOODRICH: No, this will be street improvements and that sort of thing.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So they are existing streets?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes, to improve existing streets.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Not new roads (interruption)...

SENATOR GOODRICH: And the count one, incidentally, is only for bridges.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR GOODRICH: The city street bonds would be for improvement of streets and addition of some, you know, putting in some new ones but mostly improving the ones we
