SENATOR DECAMP: Is there a motion to kill it?

SPEAKER NICHOL: He withdrew it. Oh, I understand there is another one.

SENATOR DECAMP: Well, then I'd agree to not take it up today.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right, that is fine.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman would move to indefinitely postpone, and I understand from the previous conversation that Senator DeCamp wishes not to take the bill up at this time.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Is that correct?

SENATOR DECAMP: (Microphone not activated.) ...his part, but, yes, I would agree not to take it up right now.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right. We'll move on then to LB 633. (Gavel.) Thank you.

CLERK: Mr. President, if I might, right before that, I have amendments to be printed by Senator Vickers to LB 190. (See page 1974 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 633.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 633 was a bill that was introduced by the Education Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was considered by the Legislature, Mr. President, on April 19. At that time the committee amendments were adopted. There was pending, at the time that we adjourned, a motion by Senator Carson Rogers. Senator, I understand you wish to withdraw that motion and substitute. Is that correct?

SENATOR ROGERS: Yes, it is being passed out right now.

CLERK: Mr. President, in that event Senator Rogers would move to amend the bill. As he indicated, amendments are being distributed, copies of the amendments are being distributed. (See Rogers amendment found on pages 1974-75 of the Legislative Journal.)
