

subdivisions of our government nowadays you do have a chance to vote on such an issue. I move for the adoption of my amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the Rogers amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Rogers' amendment to the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The Rogers amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have...Senator Withem, you had amendments on 1618, Senator. You want to withdraw those? The next amendment, Mr. President, I have is by Senator Vickers. Senator, your amendment is on page 1618 of the Journal.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, members, these amendments are to clean up some of the sections of the statutes that were missed last year with 994 when the 1,080 hours and the 1,032 hours were adopted. There were a couple of places in the statutes where it still referred to 175 days. These, I think, are sections of the statutes having to do with tuition and transportation of pupils. So these are basically clean up amendments to clarify the language that we adopted with 994, last year. I would urge the adoption of them amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Higgins, please.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Mr. Chairman, I didn't want to speak on these amendments. I wanted to be recognized after we vote on these amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: All right. Thank you. No other lights. Senator Vickers. The question is the adoption of the Vickers amendment to the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the adoption of the Vickers amendment. If you care to vote, please do so. Vote if you care to, please. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.
