

would even question whether it had all the amount necessary, but then rules do change in here from year to year and time to time. But that is no big deal. Senator Hefner said he did not want me to bring his bill back and attempt to kill it and because I like to respect Senator Hefner's wishes whenever possible and because about five minutes ago the Governor told me he was going to veto the bill anyway, I have concluded that we shouldn't waste any time debating the issue and simply let the fates take the bill into whatever perils it wants to go in the southeast corner of the Capitol. And so I will not pursue the motion and, as I say, let the Governor handle the chore and let Elroy deal with the Governor. And I will concentrate my efforts on shrinkage allowances.

SPEAKER NICHOL: So you wish to withdraw the motion? It is withdrawn. We will move on to General File, appropriations bill 727.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 727 was a bill that was introduced by the Appropriations Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was read originally on April 26th. It was referred directly to General File, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Warner, please.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move that LB 727 be advanced. What this bill is, as you know, is the appropriation bill to fund LB 809 which was the homestead exemption. It is there in the event that the body needs it. A majority of the body wishes to fund the homestead and obviously a lot of issues relative to revenue needs to be cleared up. I think the bill should be advanced and then if it is not needed why, fine, but if it is, it will be there.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. Clerk, I hear you have a motion on it.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Landis would move to indefinitely postpone the bill. That would lay it over if the introducer agrees to do so. Senator Landis wishes to withdraw the motion, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, that disposes of that. Senator Vard Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I
