SPEAKER NICHOL: Do you have any other suggestions?

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is indefinitely postponed. Do you have anything to read in, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do.

SPEAKER NICHOL: I would like to have you stay just a moment for a word after the Clerk reads in.

CLERK: Mr. President, Business and Labor reports LB 713 to General File with committee amendments attached. That's signed by Senator Barrett. See page 1993 of the Legislative Journal.)
