SENATOR LAMB: Madam President and members, I guess at this point I will rise to oppose the Pappas amendment, oppose the Vickers amendment and support the bill.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR MARSH: I am sorry, Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: That really wasn't the end of my speech. It was the best part, Gary says. I agree with Senator Vickers that the Senator Pappas amendment is misplaced. I also would say I guess that maybe it is not in order at this point but that Senator Vickers' amendment is misplaced, that really it will amount to about the same as killing the bill, I do believe. But I guess at this point I will just say that I oppose the Pappas amendment. I will turn my light right back on so I can speak to the Vickers amendment.

SENATOR MARSH: Now, Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Madam President and members of the Legislature, my remarks can be taken for both Senator
