

So the first two clauses deal with expanding beyond the impact on the ag economy and deal with the total economy. And then the third clause which is the major one which was brought to me by Senator Pappas and Senator Chizek in particular deals with on site inspection. The freeze negotiation would try to reach a freeze but it would include verification that would also have provided for on site inspection to make sure that we are finding that the Russians are doing exactly what we agreed to. So that on site inspection would be clearly identified in the resolution and that is the intent of the amendment. I think Senator Pappas has an amendment to that that we ought to consider at this time.

SPEAKER NICHOL: I understand we have an amendment to this amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Pappas would move to amend the Wesely amendment to the resolution. (Pappas amendment appears on page 2004 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Pappas.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Mr. Speaker, colleagues, basically my amendment just adds several words and what it does is add the words "equal and balanced" after the word "mutual". So it calls for an "equal and balanced" reduction, and I would move to adopt this amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Does anyone wish to speak on the Pappas amendment? Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Would Senator Pappas yield to a question, please?

SENATOR PAPPAS: Yes.

SENATOR GOODRICH: You just said "equal and balanced reduction". That means both sides to have come down alike.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Yes.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Which means that leaves the unbalance in place. Is that what you mean?

SENATOR PAPPAS: No, after the word "mutual" you have "equal
