Tom, that's a logical sense, but I think we have to dissect that a little bit farther, that is consumption spending and at the time when you're having economic troubles as we in the state, we are afraid that we are headed into, we...although revenues are up seven percent, we have a fear that we are going to head into some economic troubles and I agree with that and the Appropriations Committee has been very tight this year because of that condition that agriculture is in. But there is a difference between consumption and production spending. During a time of tight times you have to limit consumption spending extremely, but that may not be the time to limit production spending and I want to show you a case in point that tells this story.

SENATOR MILLER: I want to tell you, Senator Nichol, a story that illustrates this. There was a man walking across the desert and he came upon a well and he was thirsty and there was a gallon of water sitting by the well and he had two choices. He could either drink that gallon of water, use it for his purposes or he could it pour it down the hole into that well to prime the pump to get all the water that he wanted and then have another gallon of water, leave it there for the next guy that came along. Of course the obvious correct choice would be to pour that water down the well and pump the water and get all the water that you need and leave the gallon of water for the next guy. I think that we're in a very...that's production spending. I think this 204A is production spending. It doesn't necessarily mean that we're going to spend more money down the road. It means that we are going to spend...the appropriations bill calls for \$200,000 this year. It calls for \$200,000 next year and that's a lot of money. It costs more money down the road if it is decided to spend that money down the road. This appropriations this year says that we are going to invest \$200,000 to begin the process and I want to say that the livestock feeders are wholly in support of this and they are showing it by their money and they have instructed me to tell this body that by the time this comes around to Select File that they will have come up with \$100,000 of the \$200,000 to show that they have that support.
