

SENATOR HALL: Yes.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Did the League of Municipalities not appear in favor of that bill?

SENATOR HALL: No.

SENATOR HIGGINS: I was told by the League that they appeared...

SENATOR HALL: They appeared to oppose it.

SENATOR HIGGINS: They appeared to oppose your LB 98?

SENATOR HALL: LB 98 was a bill that was introduced by Senator DeCamp to the Revenue Committee that would reduce the delinquent property taxes from 14 percent to 9 percent.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Oh, excuse me, 298 was your bill.

SENATOR HALL: Yes, 298 is my bill.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Did the League take a position on that?

SENATOR HALL: Yes.

SENATOR HIGGINS: And what was their position? I was told by the League of Municipalities' representative just a few minutes ago that they were in favor of your bill.

SENATOR HALL: I would believe them.

SENATOR HIGGINS: I was told by the League of Municipalities that they don't represent just Omaha, but they represent all of the cities across the state, North Platte, Kearney, Hastings, Scottsbluff.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Labeledz, (sic), they do...

SENATOR HIGGINS: Higgins.

SENATOR HALL: They do, they represent many municipalities, but I made a mistake. They did not either support, oppose or appear in a neutral position on LB 298. They made the...

SENATOR HIGGINS: On your bill they took no position?
