SENATOR LAMB: Senator Lundy followed by Senator Labeledz and then Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR LUNDY: Mr. President, I'd call the question.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Labeledz and Senator DeCamp, did either one of you want to address this issue? Okay, we have had a motion to call the question. Are there five seconds? Yes, I see five seconds. Those in support of ceasing debate record a yes vote, those opposed vote no.

CLERK: Senator Lamb voting yes.

SENATOR LAMB: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Hall to close on his motion to bracket the bill.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President and members, I would just urge the body to vote to bracket this bill so that the bill can be worked out. It is not my intention to give the City of Omaha the opportunity to rally support to tack their amendment onto the bill. That may happen. I also have a bill on General File as you knew earlier, LB 298, that would do the same thing that I tried to do through my amendment that failed. That's going to be there whether or not the bill...it gets attached to an amendment to this bill or not. I would urge your support for bracketing this bill. Thank you.

SENATOR LAMB: The motion is the adoption of the Hall amendment to bracket the bill. Those in support vote yes, those opposed vote...pardon me, the motion is to reconsider our action. Those in support vote yes, those opposed vote no, 25 required.

CLERK: Senator Lamb voting yes.
