

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President and members of the body, I was pleased to see Senator Beutler rise and tell the body that we do have problems with this bill and that we should take more time to work these problems out. I'm glad to see him be one of the members of the body that finally agree that it has a lot of problems and that they should be worked out. However, I have to oppose his motion. We have 18 days left and we have a lot of things to do, a lot of pressure, a lot of serious decisions to make and I seriously doubt if this can be ironed out in that length of time. Therefore, beings as he has admitted we need more time, we should take another look at this, I say do not support the bracket until May, but support the bracket until January because then we'll have enough time to work out the problems. SENATOR LAMB: The Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp and then Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR DEKAMP: I think two weeks is reasonable. That's what the proposal is.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Labeledz and then Senator Hall.

SENATOR LABEDZ: (Response inaudible.)

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Beyer, did you wish to speak? If not...you did. Okay we have a motion to cease debate. Do I see five seconds? I do. The motion is to cease debate. Please vote yes if you agree. vote no if you disagree.

CLERK: Senator Lamb voting yes.

SENATOR LAMB: We're voting to cease debate. Please record your vote. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, to cease debate.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Beutler to close on his motion.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, briefly, just so that the motion is clear, it would amend the motion to bracket till next year to a motion to bracket for a couple of weeks and give us an opportunity to solve this problem this year. There comes a time in every legislative session when our tendency is to think of all the
