CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senators Haberman, Eret, Hefner, Remmers, Lynch and Miller.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President and members of the body, I would like to ask the Clerk, are there any other amendments?

CLERK: There is one other one, Senator.

SENATOR HEFNER: I was wondering if we could move to that. We're substituting one, we're changing the wording just a little and I should have that copied fairly quickly.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lynch would move to amend the bill. (Lynch amendment appears on page 2071 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. President and members, a housekeeping type of amendment. it has to do with the makeup of the Agricultural Land Evaluation Board. As you all know, this morning we repealed or did away with the ad valorem committee which was made up of five assessors and five county board members. If you'll look on page 11 you'll see that there is a seven member board, six of whom were appointed by the Governor and they were designated in the bill. My amendment simply adds that a county board member be added to that list making it seven and that where it provides for seven members it now provide for eight. Why
