Mr. President, 271A was a bill introduced by Senator Landis. (Read title.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Who is going to carry 271A? Senator Landis, were you? 271A, are you it? Okay. It is on General File.

SENATOR LANDIS: All right. I would move for the advancement of LB 271A. It is an A bill for \$190,000. Remember that the old manual that we just have turned our backs on, the '85 manual, cost us over \$200,000, so we can actually put this figure together for less...this system will be less costly to go out and find and track the figures down and do our appropriate study.
